## FAREWELL FROM REVEREND JON ROBERTS

I have a big change coming up. A big change that will affect my wife, children and myself considerably. In October my family and I will be moving to Bristol, and in November I will be starting my new job as a vicar there. I've been a 'curate' in the Dorchester Team for over 4 years, which is like being an apprentice or 'junior' - I was fully qualified after 3 years in college, and here I've been learning on the job with experienced colleagues, serving across these wonderful village communities. So I leave here fully equipped to go and be a vicar on my own... in theory!

When I first began ministry in these villages in July 2015 I was very green. Since then we've had our trials and tribulations, had our 2 boys, my own father passed away, I've conducted many funerals, baptisms, weddings, family services, civic services, communion services, assemblies in schools, and goodness knows what else! I've gotten to know a lot of people across the many villages in the Dorchester Team, and this has been a real pleasure. I've spent most of my time in Berinsfield, and have loved discovering the wealth of community spirit there. The people of Berinsfield have truly blessed me with this experience, of many extended families living alongside one another in the messiness of normal life, never losing their values of community, family, friends, work, and home. This is something that I'll take with me wherever I go.

I've loved and learned a lot working in these village communities. It will be emotional leaving, having to say goodbye to so many people I've worked with, befriended, walked with through some life-changing event, prayed with, or welcomed into the church. It's exciting heading off to pastures new, with new adventures ahead for our family, and going into a new role which will stretch me in ways I'm sure I cannot imagine. But I will not forget the people I've met and walked with in these villages, particularly the people throughout the church congregations, and the people of Berinsfield. You have all had an impact on me, helped to shape the kind of person, husband and father, and indeed priest that I am; the Dorchester Team has left your mark on me and my wife, and we will miss you.

My prayers for the villages of Berinsfield, Dorchester, The Baldons with Nuneham Courtenay, Drayton St Leonard, Stadhampton, Warborough with Newington, Clifton Hampden, Long and Little Wittenham, and Culham is that you'll be as willing and able to welcome all the other newcomers you'll be receiving over the forthcoming years, as well as you welcomed me into your churches.

That you'll have the courage to stand up for the poor, vulnerable, the foreigner and the refugee, wildlife and the environment as you were willing and able to stand up for the importance of my training for ministry and my spending time with my family. That you remember to value the things you've taught me to value, such as community, family, and above all kindness, decency and love.

Until we meet again, goodbye all - May peace and joy go with you, and God bless you.

## BALDONS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

#### Village Green Maintenance

The Neighbourhood Plan concluded that *"Marsh Baldon Green is a hugely valuable asset to The Baldons and its residents"*. Looking at past photographs, it is clear that the Green has deteriorated over the years. It is now looking increasingly unkempt and unless restorative action is taken there is a danger that area of the Green will be lost to saplings and bramble. These must be removed, and the area routinely cleared. With the right action the original view through the trees, along the ditch, from the north to the south will return.

The willow trees along the ditch are deteriorating. Two had to be removed following the strong winds and others need pollarding to preserve them. Other trees need specialist intervention to keep them safe.

At the Parish Council meeting on 9<sup>th</sup> September, Councillors discussed the condition of the Green and it was agreed to gather estimates for dealing with the trees as well as restoring and maintaining the Green. The cost of these activities may mean an increase in the precept for the year ahead.

The state of the track along the southside continues to cause concern. Due to large and irregular potholes, cars are often seen driving along the edge of the Green. Over the years, the track has increased in width, thereby eroding the Green. Following discussion with Queens College land agents The Council is committed to restoring the Green to its original boundary, reducing the track to 5m wide. Over the next few months, the Council will be gathering the views of householders along the south track on the way forward.

#### Village pond

Pictures in the Neighbourhood Plan clearly show that, once upon a time, the village pond, by the School, was clearly visible to residents and visitors. Sadly, it has become surrounded by bushes and brambles. In addition, the pond is being lost to weeds and reeds which need to be removed. With some hard work, the village pond could be restored as a visible asset to the Baldons.

#### Can you help on Sunday 20th October?

Is there a group of villagers willing to form a task force to tackle the pond? The Council intends to hold a **Community Village Green Action Day** on Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> October to tackle the pond as a priority.

#### Oxford to Cambridge Expressway

We have no additional information at present on this matter having circulated the latest information from the Expressway Action group a few weeks ago we are awaiting the Highways Agency publication of plans and consultation. SODC councilors have voted to oppose the Expressway.

*Court House Toot Baldon P19/S2630/FUL*. An application for replacement gates with remotely controlled black metal gates. The council has indicated no objections to the plan

*Low Hill Farmhouse P19/S2180/HH.* An application for conversion of an existing barn to ancillary accommodation tied to the main house. The Parish Council has supported the plan.

Boundary House MB P19/S2780/HH. An application for a replacement garage and garden room, currently being considered by Parish Council



#### News from our District Councilor

SODC are still debating the Local plan with concern about the number and location of houses needed for the district. There is pressure from the County Council and other bodies to agree to the original plan prepared by the previous council due to the tie up with money from Government for infrastructure. SODC's plans should be clearer after a meeting in October.

SODC will be prioritizing cycling routes in future planned developments and have appointed a cycling champion (our district councilor Sam Casey Rehaye). If you have views about cycling and safe cycling routes, she is interested to hear from you.

# Oxfordshire County Council is urging residents who have been affected by suicide to give their feedback to help shape a suicide prevention strategy

In Oxfordshire there is a determination to reduce the number of deaths by suicide. The Oxfordshire Suicide Prevention Multi-Agency Group formed in 2014 and brings together public, private and charity sector organisations, all of whom are committed to suicide prevention.

The Oxfordshire suicide prevention group is about to revise its action plan and develop a strategy and wants to hear from people in Oxfordshire who have been affected by suicide or who may have had suicidal thoughts themselves.

## NUNEHAM COURTENAY PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The next Parish Council Meeting will be on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> November 2019 at 7pm in the Village Hall. The last meeting was on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> September. It discussed all the usual subjects such as planning, the Playing Field, speeding, and the possible purchase of a defibrillator.

A parishioner attended the meeting to ask if the Parish Council could pay for a water butt at the churchyard and the meeting also discussed a couple of things that come around regularly.

The first of these was polling arrangements for the parish. South Oxfordshire District Council asked for comments so the Parish Council has recommended that the parish continues to vote at the Village Hall.

The second was winter salt. There are no County Council salt bins in the parish and the Parish Council is not suggesting one is needed but the Parish Council is going to order winter salt so residents can put salt on minor roads and the footways – the County Council only grits the A4074 and the B4015.

A reminder that Parish Council Meetings are open to the public and there is still one vacancy on the Parish Council so you can not only attend the meetings but you could also put your name forward to become a parish councillor and take a full part in them.
